

**Oak Ridge Sportsmens Association
Civilian Marksmanship Program
Springfield / Vintage Military Rifle Matches**

DATES: April 20, Oct. 19 and Nov. 16, 2008; Registration at 10:00 a.m., first shot at 11:00 a.m.

LOCATION: Oak Ridge, Tennessee. The ORSA range is located on the Oak Ridge Turnpike (State Route 95), 3.5 miles west of the intersection of Illinois Ave. (State Route 62) and the Turnpike. The range entrance is the first road on the left after stoplight No. 16, Nebraska Ave.

ELIGIBILITY: Open to all US citizens at least 14 years of age. First time competitors not holding a current NRA HP Rifle classification card must complete at least one CMP Service Rifle clinic before firing a CMP Springfield or Garand match. Participation enables all qualified competitors to purchase the rifles authorized under the CMP Rifle sales program (see www.odcmp.com for details). CMP certificates of competition will be issued to competitors at the conclusion of the match upon request.

RULES: Current CMP Competition Rules will apply.

All Springfield competitors will be issued ammunition (30-06) on the firing line. Non-Springfield competitors will supply their own ammunition (55 rnds.) Shooters will be responsible for any clips needed in the rapid fire stages.

SQUADDING: All competitors must check in at the ORSA Clubhouse at least one hour prior to the start of the match (10:00 am) to receive a relay and target assignment and to be issued ammo. Competitors needing to share the same rifle will be accommodated whenever possible.

SCORING AND PIT OPERATION: All competitors will pull targets and score for other shooters.

SPRINGFIELD RIFLE: As Issued US .30 Caliber M1903 Springfield series rifles (Rule 6.2.4). Rifles must conform in weight and dimensions to the standard issue service rifle and must have not less than a 4.5-pound trigger pull. Re-barreling with a barrel of as-issued dimensions is allowed. No other alterations such as glass bedding, fitting of National Match parts, use of after market sights, or use of synthetic stocks are allowed.

VINTAGE MILITARY RIFLE: US Model 1917 or US Krag rifles (Rule 6.2.4) or any foreign issued military bolt-action rifle (Rule 6.2.5). Rifle must be in a safe condition and not modified from the original “**as issued**” condition.

AMMUNITION: .30 cal. M2 ball ammunition will be issued at registration for all U.S. rifles. Non-U.S. rifle users must supply their own ammunition (55 rounds).

COURSE OF FIRE: Similar to CMP Course B (Table 8). All stages are fired from the 200 yd. line on the NRA SR-1 target:

- Stage 1 - Prone, slow fire, up to 5 sighting shots and 20 record shots, in 25 minutes.
- Stage 2 - Prone from Standing, rapid fire, 10 shots, 80 seconds.
- Stage 3 - Sitting from Standing, rapid fire, 10 shots, 80 seconds.
- Stage 4 - Standing, slow fire, 10 shots, 10 minutes.

AWARDS: Awards will be made to recognize the high scoring Springfield and Vintage Military rifle shooters.
