LOCATION: Oak Ridge, Tennessee. The ORSA range is located on the Oak Ridge Turnpike (State Route 95) 3.5 miles west of it's intersection with Illinois Ave. (State Route 62). The range entrance is the first road on the left after stop light no. 16 at Nebraska Ave.

ELIGIBILITY: Open. First-time competitors not holding a current NRA HP Rifle classification card must complete at least one CMP Service Rifle clinic before firing a CMP Games event at ORSA. Participation enables qualified competitors to purchase rifles authorized under the CMP Rifle Sales program (see www.odcmp.com for details).

RULES: Current CMP Competition Rules will apply.

ENTRY FEE: \$20.00 per match.

REGISTRATION AND SQUADDING: 8:00am Saturday and 11:00am Sunday at the ORSA Clubhouse. All competitors must check in at least 30 minutes prior to the start of each match to receive a relay and target assignment. Competitors needing to share the same rifle will be accommodated whenever possible.

SCORING AND PIT OPERATION: Competitors will pull targets and score for other relays.

CHALLENGES: A fee of \$1.00 will be charged in advance for each challenge.

RIFLES: As-Issued Military Rifle (Rule 6.3.1). Must conform in weight and dimensions to the standard issue service rifle. Re-barreling with a barrel of as-issued dimensions is allowed. No other alterations such as glass bedding, shims, National Match parts, special purpose sights for sniping or competition, or the use of synthetic stocks is allowed. Specific requirements are noted below under the conditions of each match.

AMMUNITION: .30 caliber M2 Ball ammunition will be issued and used by all competitors firing arms chambered to the .30-06 cartridge. All others must provide their own safe ammunition (Rule 6.7.1).

AWARDS: CMP Achievement Awards will be presented to all competitors firing qualified scores.

MATCH SCHEDULE:

Saturday 9:00am

Match 1 – John C. Garand Match

Rifles: As-Issued M1 Garand or M1941 Johnson (Rule 6.3.2), M1903 Springfield (Rule 6.3.3), M1 Carbine (Rule 6.3.5), M1917 or US Krag (Rule 6.3.4).

Course of Fire: John C. Garand Match Course A (Rule 9.2.1, Table 7). All stages are fired at 200 yards on the SR target.

Stage 1 - Prone, slow fire, 5 sighter shots and 10 record shots, 15 minutes

Stage 2 - Prone from standing, rapid fire, 10 shots, 70 seconds

Stage 3 - Standing, slow fire, 10 shots, 10 minutes

Match 2 – Springfield / Vintage Military Rifle Match

Rifles: As-Issued US M1903 or M1903A3 (Rule 6.3.3), M1917 or US Krag (Rule 6.3.4), or Foreign Bolt Action Military Rifle (Rule 6.3.6).

Course of Fire: As-Issued Military Rifle Match Course A (Rule 9.2.1, Table 7). All stages are fired at 200 yards on the SR target.

Stage 1 - Prone, slow fire, 5 sighter shots and 10 record shots, 15 minutes

Stage 2 - Prone from standing, rapid fire, 10 shots, 80 seconds

Stage 3 - Standing, slow fire, 10 shots, 10 minutes

Sunday 12:00 Noon

Match 3 – M1 Carbine Match

Rifles: As-Issued M1 Carbine (Rule 6.3.5). Standard as-issued 15-round magazines or magazines of the same shape, length, and configuration must be used. **30-round magazines may not be used.**

Course of Fire: M1 Carbine Match Course (Rule 9.5.1, Table 9). All stages are fired at 100 yards on the SR-1 reduced target.

Sighting - Any position, slow fire, up to 10 sighter shots, 10 minutes

Stage 1 - Prone, slow fire, 10 record shots, 5 minutes

Stage 2 - Prone from standing, rapid fire, 10 shots, 60 seconds

Stage 3 - Sitting or kneeling from standing, rapid fire, 10 shots, 60 seconds

Stage 4 - Standing, slow fire, 10 shots, 10 minutes
